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Sporting Achievements

This has been another incredibly successful term for sporting achievements at St Wilfrid's RC College.

In football our Year 8 boys team have reached the semi-finals of both the Joicey and the TUC County Cups. The year 10 team have also made it to the semi-final of the County Cup.

In indoor cricket the under 13 girls won the South Tyneside Cricket tournament, the East Durham finals and then the Durham County Finals remaining unbeaten throughout. They will now represent Durham in the Nationals after Easter. The under 13 boys won the South Tyneside Cricket Tournament winning every game. The under 15 girls won the under 15 South Tyneside Cricket Tournament and then finish as runners up at the county finals.

In Handball our under 13 boys and under 13 girls teams both won the South Tyneside finals. The boys then finished as runners up in the Tyne and Wear finals and the girls won every game to become Tyne and Wear Champions. The under 15 girls won the South Tyneside Handball finals and then finished runners up in the Tyne and Wear Finals.

We have also had success in rowing, dance and futsal across multiple year groups. Our 9 and 10 sports leaders have also successfully organised and delivered a Year 2 athletics festival at Temple Park.

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School Council

The School Council has been involved in the authority wide Body Image project. Four representatives joined the Youth Parliament at the Town Hall to take part in workshops and plan the strategies to roll out in schools. The Council have presented two assemblies highlighting Body Image. The first was based around true / false questions that were intended to raise awareness of the problems. The second was on the effect of the media on young peoples' perception of Body Image. A questionnaire was filled in by Years 7-10 to collect information to inform the Youth Parliament's future strategies on the subject. The Council held The Make Your Mark ballot at the beginning of the year following an assembly outlining the possible topics to vote for. The whole school took part in the Ballot.
