


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The Spanish Apprentice

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Sporting Achievements

This has been another incredibly successful term for sporting achievements at St Wilfrid's RC College.

We are very proud of all our pupils who represented St. Wilfrid's in athletics this term. At the QuadKids Athletics event, our Year 7 and 8 boys teams finished 3rd and 4th respectively and our Year 7 and 8 girls teams finished 4th and 5th in their respective events. A special mention must go to Rebecca Harrison, Jake Waters and Amy Stewart, who finished 1st, 2rd and 3rd in their respective indidival competitions. Also in athletics, we also finished third overall in South Tyneside in the Athletics Championships at Monkton Stadium with our Year 8/9 girls being best teams in their categories. Again, special mentions to Jake Waters (1500m), Amy Stewart (800m), Ryan Stewart (1500m), Paul Mathias (high jump), Huseyin Simsir (javelin), Lily Jary (200m) and Rachel Hayter (tripe jump) who won their respective events.

In cricket, the Under 13 boys cricket team were South Tyneside and Tyne and Wear outdoor champions, as well as finishing 5th in the North of England Outdoor competition. The Under 15 girls cricket team also represented Durham County Cricket Club at the North of England Outdoor competition where they also finished 5th, concluding an outstanding year for cricket at St. Wilfrid's.

The Under 13 and Under 15 tennis teams were successful at the South Tyneside Tennis competition, with our Under 15 girls claiming 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in the doubles event. There was also a 3rd and 4th place finish for the Under 13 girls. The Under 15 boys and Under 13 boys tennis teams also claimed 2nd and 3rd place in their respective competitions. In golf, our Under 15 boys golf team claimed 2nd and 3rd place at the South Tyneside Golf Xtreme competition, qualifying to represent South Tyneside at the Tyne and Wear Finals where they finished 4th. In the South Tyneside rounders competition, our Year 7 team and Year 9 girls teams finished runners up with our Year 8 girls finishing third.

We also competed in an event focused entirely around participation, Year 7 & 8 students competed in a dodgeball tournament whereby the only pupils that could enter were those who had not represented St. Wilfrid's previously. Our pupils thoroughly enjoyed the event and represented the school superbly! We're sure you'll agree St. Wilfrid's pupils have done us all proud this year.
