Thank you very much for your support so far in encouraging your child to engage with the work on the 'Online Learning' page on our website. As you know, each subject sets tasks each week for your child to complete. These tasks are a blend of revisiting and retrieving prior content from this year in order to consolidate their existing knowledge and skills, as well as the introduction of carefully selected new content, in line with National Curriculum or examination specifications.

Alongside this more formal learning, we have also shared our student newsletter, subject challenges, 'Big 20' challenges and our book club. Hopefully you will agree that this gives a nice balance to the work and supports the well-being of our students. To support students in setting goals for the day and planning their time, we recommend that they continue to use the 'home learning timetable' available on our website.

As it is looking increasingly likely that we could remain closed to the majority of pupils for an extended period of time, we need to make a change to the way that we are setting our online learning tasks. Over the next couple of weeks, we will move away from the setting of work via the 'Online Learning' page and we will set the work on Google Classroom instead. The move to Google Classroom means that there will be the opportunity for a two-way flow of communication between teachers and students, enabling students to upload work and to receive feedback about their learning.

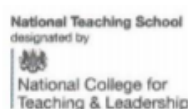
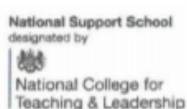
