Learning:

Year 10 and 12 internal exams

Year 11 and 13 Revision

Y11 and Y13 Spanish and Portuguese Speaking Tests

Spanish and Portuguese GCSE and A-level final speaking exams will take place the first week back after the Easter holidays. Pupils' individual exam time slots have been shared with them by their class teacher and they are also available for them to check on their Spanish Google Classroom. They must head to the new chapel at the time stated for their prep time and they should spend some time over Easter making sure they feel confident with their general conversation answers.
