# Reading Time

St Wilfrid's is committed to fostering a love of reading. In order to give our students every possible opportunity to become fluent readers, we have built time into the school day for students to spend time reading. ## Year 11 STEP & Supported Study

Our first STEP cycle with Year 11 begins next week, which will take place each week until October half term. STEP is our small group intervention programme which runs after school from 3.10-4.10pm, on a Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday. If your child is chosen for STEP it is an expectation that they attend. All pupils will be made aware of any STEP sessions they have been chosen for by their tutor on Monday.

Supported study is an open invitation for Year 11 pupils to stay in school after 3.10pm to complete any independent learning. Saints Cafe will be supervised until 5pm by a member of staff on a Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday. Pupils do not have to sign up, attend each evening or stay until 5pm, we would just like to make a quiet space available to our pupils to study after school.

A credit will be awarded towards their 'Passport to Prom' for every STEP or supported study session a pupil attends.

This week we have launched 'Passport to Prom' with Year 11, where we have challenged our pupils to achieve 60 credits throughout the academic year in order to receive their invitation to prom. Pupils can achieve credits for demonstrating any of the Catholic Virtues, and they will also be provided with a fortnightly theme to specifically encourage them to focus on a key area of school life that is relevant to them. On Monday we will be talking to pupils about being 'the best version of themselves', and rewarding Year 11 for making a positive start inside the classroom and being a role model to our younger pupils throughout the school day.
