

All students at St Wilfrid's have access to Sora; a fabulous online app where hundreds of E-books and audiobooks can be accessed. It is an expectation that all Year 11 students maximise this opportunity and refer to the poster in their tutor rooms on a daily basis to ensure they are aware of their timetabled sessions.

Personal Development: Values Day - Monday 21 November

On Monday 21 November we are collapsing the timetable to focus on some key aspects of our holistic curriculum. Year 7 Mental Health Advent Challenge

On Monday 21 November, Year 7 students will bring home a #mentalhealth5aweek advent calendar card. Throughout the day on Monday 21 we will have explored British Values, Gospel Values and our school values. We hope that this can continue at home and you can share your family values together by encouraging your child to participate in some simple activites.

Each week there are 5 'challenges'. For example 'Go for a walk with your family and take a family selfie' and 'before you get asked, offer to clean your bedroom, even if you share'. The five suggested activities each week focus upon: <u>**G**</u>ive, <u>**R**</u>elate, <u>**E**</u>nergise, <u>**A**</u>wareness and <u>**T**</u>ry (**GREAT** values that boost mental wellbeing). We hope students will be able to complete at least three per week - they needn't all be from the same row.
