Different head injuries, and how to help someone with a head injury both minor and severe	Year 10 – Basic Life support / patient is not breathing / Bone, muscle and joint injuries / bleeding and shock / chest pain / choking / first aid scenarios	DRSABC – Danger / Response / Shout / Airway / Breathing / Circulation  CPR – Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation  AED – Automated External Defibrillator  Allergen – A substance that causes an allergic reaction  Asthma attack – Muscles of the air passages go into spasm causing the passages to narrow making breathing difficult  Concussion – Temporary injury to the brain usually caused by a bump, blow or jolt  Compression – Bleeding and/or swelling inside of the skull
