

Year 11

This week, Year 11 have focused on setting themselves apart from their competition. We have introduced several interventions so far this year to support our Year 11 students to be the very best they can be and on Monday we discussed the importance of maximising these opportunities to ensure they fulfil their potential this academic year and reach their aspirational next steps.

One way students aimed to set themselves apart from their competition was to get a head start on their revision ahead of their October prelims, as students focused on the revision technique 'look, cover, write, check' with their tutor. Effective use of 'flash cards' will be demonstrated to students in next week's reading time revision session and in their Monday Morning Assembly, Year 11 will be introduced to Microsoft Teams and how this platform can be utilised to complete assignments and refer to lesson or revision resources during independent study.

First Aid at St Wilfrid's

This week we welcomed our new first aider, Mrs Jewitt. Mrs Jewitt is based in the medical room, which is connected to Saints Café - the central area of school.

To help Mrs Jewitt get to know our students that have existing medical conditions and needs, we are updating our individual healthcare plans (IHPs). The IHP is a document that records the medical condition, symptoms and the support that some children need at school. We will contact parents/carers of children that this applies to.

Also, it is imperative that all medication is brought to school by parents and a medication form is completed with consent for us to administer it. Students must not carry paracetamol or other tablets on their person or in their bags. Thank you for your support with this.

What are T-Levels?

T Levels are technical-based qualifications developed in collaboration with employers and businesses, with content that meets the needs of industry and prepares students for work, further training, or study.

T Levels are two-year courses that can be studied by 16-18 year olds after finishing their GCSEs. T Levels are based on the same standards as apprenticeships, designed by employers and approved

by the Institute for Apprenticeships and Technical Education.
