Year 11

Our Year 11 students have just five weeks left of the first term of this crucial year. In their assembly on Monday morning, the strategies which will be implemented with our students for the remainder of this term will be outlined to them, so they are fully aware of how they will be supported as we continue to build momentum following their first set of prelim examinations.

- STEP Cycle 2 Some students have been part of a recent cycle focusing on vocational subjects, however from Monday 27 November, STEP Cycle 2 will commence which will involve a wide range of subjects. STEP is our targeted intervention programme for small groups of students in specific subjects and your child must check with their tutor which sessions they have been selected to attend.
- Homework Planner Year 11 will receive a bespoke homework planner in December which will help them plan to manage their time effectively, ensuring all homework is completed on time and the time spent on their subjects is balanced appropriately to give them the best possible chance of successful summer outcomes.
- Prelim Reflection It is vitally important that our students learn positively from the experience
 of their October prelims; therefore, they will complete a reflection exercise using their prelim
 results to allow them to set individualised targets. Those targets will allow our students to
 strive for continuous improvement as they aim to be the best version of themselves.
