Ring Fenced Apprenticeship Opportunity With AESC



The UK is likely to create up to 78,000 new jobs by 2040 in battery supply chain and electrical vehicle manufacturing, with the North East at the cutting edge of the sector. Manufacturing accounts for around 11% of employment across the region with one in three cars and 26% of all electric vehicles made in the UK are produced here.

AESC are one of the employers at the forefront of electric vehicle production and are currently being building one of Europe's biggest EV battery manufacturing plants at the International Advanced Manufacturing Park (IAMP) as part of a £450million investment which will create well over 750 new green jobs.

They are currently recruiting **10 Level 3 Maintenance Technicians** with a starting salary of **£16,521** who will work on the production line supporting electric vehicle battery production.

Recruitment is open until 31st May and South Tyneside Council are funding four of those apprenticeships through their apprenticeship levy transfer which means four roles will be ring-fenced for South Tyneside applicants.
